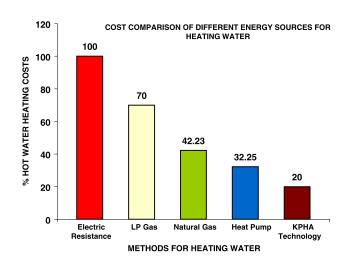


OUTSTANDING SOLUTION
